The Demon Lover, Elizabeth Bowen's tale of guilt and retribution, comes to The Leper Chapel, Newmarket Road, on 19 May.

in situ's latest performance features Richard Spaul telling one of the greatest short stories of all time, as well as Saki's *Gabriel-Ernest*, an uncanny exploration of homoeroticism in upper-class Edwardian society, and Beatrix Potter's *The Tale of Jemima Puddleduck*.

In Bowen's story, a woman swears eternal love to her soldier sweetheart in 1916. He is reported missing, presumed killed. Years later, in London during the Blitz, she receives a letter from him.

And *The Tale of Jemima Puddleduck:* a silly story for children? Not in Richard Spaul's highly original performance, in which a vulnerable adult's search for independence leads to a dismal house in the woods, a calculating abuser and the threat of murder.

The stories are combined with songs by Noel Coward, Screaming Jay Hawkins and others in a complex, provocative and fascinatingly disturbing evening's viewing.

Tickets for *The Demon Lover*, at The Leper Chapel, Newmarket Road, Cambridge, are £12, £10 concessions. Performances are at 8pm. Tickets can be bought on the door from 7.30pm, but space is limited, advance booking recommended via www.insitutheatre.co.uk.
